Skill Sets

Imagine yourself on the side of a road watching fluid leak out of a commercial vehicle or having to communicate with a distraught mother who only speaks Korean and has lost her child. The CapWIN v2 Mobile Client possesses a unique feature that no other known application provides to its users. That feature is the ability to search for users with specific training and skill sets, not only from within your agency, but also across agencies. There are currently 65 available skill sets. A quick search of the CapWIN v2 Directory provides a listing of users with expertise in multiple areas, along with ways of contacting those users. In order to provide the maximum return for this feature, it is



incumbent upon you the user to keep your skill sets up to date. If you possess a specialty skill or have training in an unique area please have your Agency Administrator add those skills to your User Profile. If there is a skill that you do not see listed and would like to have added, send a short e-mail to alee@capwin.org and we will evaluate for possible future use.

FY '12 Invoicing

As we approach the beginning of a new fiscal year, CapWIN staff are preparing invoices, which will be mailed to subscribing agencies in the near future. As you may be aware, agency subscription costs are based upon the number of devices running the CapWIN Mobile Client. The fees are not based upon the number of user accounts. This results in cost savings for those agencies with limited budgets where users share resources and equipment. In order to ensure accurate billing it is critical that CapWIN be aware of any devices you have added or in many cases removed from your inventory. To get ahead of the curve start inventorying all of your laptops and desktops running CapWIN at this time and you may end up saving money. E-mails will be sent to all Agency Points of Contact and Administrators over the next few weeks with further details.

MILES Sunsets

Maryland law enforcement agencies have been advised by the Maryland State Police (MSP) that the older Maryland Inter-Agency Law Enforcement System (MILES) will be turned off effective July 1, 2011. The newer Maryland Electronic Telecommunications Enforcement Resource System (METERS) is now operational. All Maryland law enforcement agencies utilizing CapWIN have previously been transitioned.

The CapWIN V2 Mobile Client course is designed for all users of the CapWIN System, both sworn and non-sworn. This is the main course recommended for all CapWIN Users.
